
Inter-college contest throws light on environment threats

and marketing knowledge
and related expertise.

Students also get practical
training, soft skill training
and attend workshops so that
they become employable and
join workforce after the
course. BBA can be a good
foundation for students inter-
ested in pursuing the Masters
in Business Administration

BBA OR BCom

Both BBA and BCom have
several similarities in the
course structure. However,
BCom focuses on the theoretical
aspects more than the
professional and real-world
applications of the subjects.
On the other hand, BBA
involves practical applica-
tions and students may learn
with the help of projects and
case studies. Here we have
presented the course struc-
ture of both BBA and BCom
for students to compare.

MAKE YOUR CHOICE SAFELY

A good career is based on
how much effort you put in
rather than your field of
study. Both courses can be
good career choices depend-
ing on your aptitude, skill
and interests. However, as
seen from the comparisons,
a student can choose
BCom, if he/she is inter-
ested in mathematics
and willing to learn the
nitty-gritty of account-
ancy, economics and
other related subjects
that are needed to run an
organisation. On the other
hand, a student pursuing
BBA may find it easier to
enter the management pro-
fession equipped with
required skills.

So, before you start choos-
ing an undergraduate course
after Class XII, you should
