### BBA - DEVELOPING MANAGERIAL SKILLS

Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) is a three-year undergraduate programme which focuses on the fields of business and management. It is a professional course that prepares the students for a career in management with the necessary skills such as managerial skills, operational and marketing knowledge and related expertise.

Students also get practical training, soft skill training and attend workshops so that they become employable and join workforce after the course. BBA can be a good foundation for students interested in pursuing the Masters in Business Administration (MBA) or postgraduate

streams are eligible for the BBA after Class XII. Some of the institutes may require students to have mathematics in their Class XII. The best part - there are multiple streams to pursue in BBA itself like family business, business analytics. Students pursuing BBA can pursue MBA or postgraduate

streams in India like CAT, XAT, NMAT, MAT, CMAT,

On the other hand, BBA involves practical applications and students may learn with the help of projects and case studies. A good career is based on how much effort you put in rather than your field of study. Both courses can be good career choices depending on your aptitude, skill and interests. However, as seen from the comparisons, a student can choose

On the other hand, a student pursuing BBA may find it easier to pursue an MBA degree and enter the management profession equipped with required skills.

So, before you start choosing an undergraduate course after Class XII, you should determine your interests and career goals. Only after a successful assessment of your skills, you can make your

choice.

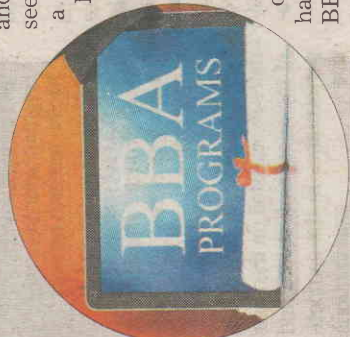
