
In 2008, the college shifted to another temporary location at the Female Literacy Building in Sector 42, Chandigarh (now the RUSA office).



# **ACADEMIC EXAMINATION**

The examination branch functions under **Dr. Magesh V, Registrar, Examinations,** heads his team professionally in successful running of its operations. The branch ensures smooth conduct of the **House Examination and University Examinations** for a total strength of 811 students (495 boys and 316 girls). They also take care of **internal assessment** to be sent to Panjab University as per norms. We may be a college in its first phase of growth, but our students have shown appreciable performance in the University Examinations. **Our results are better than the university pass percentage.** 

During the annual prize distribution function, students excelling in academics, sports, co-curricular and extra-curricular are awarded with the Roll of Honours, College Colours, Certificates of Merit and prizes for their performance in academics, cultural activities, sports and other activities held in the college. This year we awarded 08 students with Roll of Honour, 38 with College Colour and 65 with certificates of merit. Mid-semester tests assess students' comprehension before final examinations, ensuring academic integrity through structured invigilation. Previous years' question papers aid in effective preparation. Conducted within a set timeframe, these tests help faculty identify areas for improvement.

## **SPORTS**

Our college is committed to promoting **sportsmanship** and fostering a spirit of **healthy competition** among students. To support this, we offer a wide range of **indoor and outdoor sports facilities**. Both staff and students actively participate in various games, including **Chess, Carrom, Table Tennis, Badminton, Football, Cricket,** and **Basketball**. The **Annual Athletics Meet** stands out as a signature event where faculty and students come together to participate in a variety of **fun games and track and field events**. During the **2024–25 academic session**, our college proudly participated in numerous sports events. These events reflect our commitment to **holistic development** and the encouragement of **physical fitness** within our community. A total of 75 students —72 boys and 3 girls—represented our institution at the Panjab University Inter College Tournament.

### **HOSTEL GUIDELINES AND RULES (2025-26)**

The college has two hostels, one for boys and one for girls having a capacity to accommodate total 250 students. Rooms will be allotted to the students independently.

### APPLICATION PROCESS

- Online Application: Candidates must select the "YES" option for hostel accommodation in the
  online admission form available at www.dhe.chd.gov.in
- Eligibility Criteria: Hostel seats are allocated on first come first served basis.
- Seat Validity: Hostel accommodation is granted for only one academic year. A seat can be
  denied to the old student next year if his/ her conduct, attendance and result of the mid semester
  and annual examinations have not been up to the mark.
- Admission Rights: All rights of admission to the college hostels are reserved with the Principal.

### ADMISSION PROCESS

- Step 1: College Admission
- Step 2: Confirmation of Hostel seat by the Admission Committee
- Step 3: Payment of College and Hostel Fees
- **Step 4:** Download Complete Hostel Admission Form from the College website **www.gccbachd.org** in the college prospectus.
- **Step 5:** Room allotment is subject to the submission of the following documents at the time of joining the hostel (to be downloaded from the College website <a href="www.gccbachd.org">www.gccbachd.org</a> or found in the college prospectus):
- Duly filled Hostel Accommodation Form.
- Health Status Undertaking by the Parents.
- Hostel's Medical Fitness Certificate by an authorized Doctor.
- Latest Passport size photographs of the Parents as well as of the Local Guardians.
- Latest family photograph (Postcard size).
- Copy of the Aadhar card.
- Copy of the voter's card / proof of registration of voter's card (if eligible).
- Copy of Passport/ Driving License.
- Admission to the college doesn't ensure the right of the candidate to the hostel seat.

### IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

#### > FOR STUDENTS

- Medical Disclosure: Students with chronic illnesses or psychiatric conditions must disclose them during the admission process. Non-disclosure will lead to cancellation of hostel accommodation.
- Reporting Time: Admitted students must report to the hostel as intimated on college website.
- Property Damage: Students who break hostel locks, seals, or damage property will have to pay
  a fine of Rs.1000 and cost of damaged property. Repeated offense will lead to suspension of the
  defaulter.
- Outstation Visits: Outstation visits require prior written permission from the Hostel Authorities.
- Bank Account: Resident students must have a bank account.
- Vacation Stay: Students are not allowed to stay in hostels during winter/summer vacations.
- Dress Code: Students must follow a decent dress code in the hostel and college campus.
- Disciplinary Action: Disciplinary action will be taken against students for not attending classes, misbehavior, ragging, or harassment.
- Essential Items: Students must bring essential items such as bedding, bed linen, curtains, bucket, mug, duster, broom, and personal medical supplies, etc.
- Hostel ID Cards: Hostel ID cards must be carried at all times and submitted at the main gate
  when leaving campus.
- Regularity: The students have to attend classes regularly and are not allowed to leave college
  premises during the college hours.

#### > FOR PARENTS

- Accommodation for Parents: Parents must make their own accommodation arrangements as
  the admission process may take more than one day.
- Local Guardians: Parents must submit an affidavit authorizing two local guardians who are
  residents of Tricity. Unmarried men and students (girls/boys) will not be accepted as local
  guardians. Full contact details, including phone, email, and permanent address, of the local
  guardians must be provided.
- **Physical Presence**: The physical presence of the candidate, along with parents and local guardian, is mandatory on the day of hostel admission.

• Change of Address or Contact Number: Change of Address/Telephone number of the local guardians must be informed and updated by the parents to the Hostel Authorities in writing through hostel e-mail ID.

### LEAVE RULES

- A resident student can avail night out/ weekend leave only twice a month.
- Outings will be allowed only with prior permission of parents/ local guardians in writing.
- Residents must enter timings of departure and arrival in the register maintained by Hostel Authorities
- Resident students are allowed to go out for coaching after college hours but before attendance timings, upon submission of an affidavit from their parents, at their own responsibility. Proof of attendance must be submitted from coaching centre.

### **MESS RULES**

• Fee Payment: Mess dues must be paid by the 7th of every month; late payment attracts Rs.50/day fine. After 7<sup>th</sup> day, mess service will be suspended.

- **Diet Count**: Minimum diet count as decided by the Hostel Committee is compulsory.
- Guest Policy: No guests are allowed in the mess without the permission of the Hostel Authorities.
- Meal Service: Meals must be taken in the dining hall. No room service is allowed.
- Dress Code: Proper dress is mandatory in the mess.
- Meal Timings:

❖ Breakfast: 7:30 AM - 9:00 AM

Lunch: 1:00 PM - 2:30 PM

❖ Dinner: 7:30 PM - 9:00 PM

### RESIDENCE RULES

- Ragging: Ragging is strictly prohibited and punishable offense.
- Room Allocation: No room change is allowed after allocation.
- Room Security: Students must lock their rooms before leaving. The college is not responsible for any kind of loss.
- **Drug Free Campus**: The use or possession of tobacco, alcohol, drugs, or any other intoxicants inside the hostel or on campus is strictly forbidden and will result in immediate expulsion.
- Energy Conservation: Lights, fans, and other electrical devices must be switched off when rooms are unoccupied.

#### MEDICAL FITNESS

- Medical Fitness Certificate: It is mandatory for the residential student to attach Medical fitness
  certificate by an authorized Medical Practitioner (MBBS qualified) with the Hostel Admission
  Form at the time of hostel admission. The Medical Certificate should include the student's blood
  group. If a student is suffering from any allergy, then the same should also be mentioned.
- **Emergency:** In case of medical emergency, the student will be taken to the nearest Government Dispensary/ Hospital.
- Non-disclosure of information: Non-disclosure of information related to any serious medical
  condition will result in the cancellation of the hostel seat. In case this fact is concealed from the
  authorities at the time of admission, the college will not be responsible for any emergency that
  may arise.
- **Payment of expenditure:** The College will initially cover any expenses incurred, but they must be reimbursed by the student or their parents later.
- \* THE PRINCIPAL RESERVES THE RIGHT TO CHANGE ANY HOSTEL RULES AND HOLDS FULL AUTHORITY TO TAKE ACTION AGAINST ANY VIOLATIONS.




