The College had a very humble beginning in terms of student input and infrastructure in July 2007 but since then it has witnessed an unprecedented growth. The college is successfully running B. B. A. and B. C. A. courses in addition to B. Com. and M. Com. Courses.

Teaching Faculty

The college is yet to have its own sanctioned posts. However, in addition to the Principal we have Dean and Vice Principal who are looking after academics and administration to run the affairs of the college. The Principal of the college is Dr. Shashi Wahi Khullar. The Dean of this College is Dr. Sangam Kapoor and Dr. Amarpreet Singh Sijher is designated the Vice Principal. Amongst the teaching faculty, ten regular staff members and the librarian have been deputed from various government colleges. The Department of Higher Education has also appointed twelve full-time Assistant Professors on contract basis against additional sanctioned posts. In addition, 08 temporary teaching faculty members for BBA and BCA courses have been appointed under CHES-GCCBA 50

Society. Their consistent efforts, passion and hard work has led to smooth functioning of the college. We have scaled new heights for the students in the fields of academics, sports, and extra-curricular activities.

The Administrative Office

College activities are incomplete without the cooperation of the administrative staff that coordinates with the teaching staff to ensure smooth functioning of the institution. The Senior Assistant of the college, Mr. Bhupinder Singh heads the administrative section. His team comprises of Mrs. Sakshi Rani, Mrs. Surjit Kaur, Mrs. Dalbir Kaur, Mrs. Shitu Gupta and Mr. Kuldeep Singh as the supporting clerical staff. Mrs. Monika has been designated as Data Entry Operator, Mr. Ashwani Kumar as Computer Operator and, Mr. Sanjeev Kumar, Steno, actively assist the Head of the Institute to carry her official proceedings. Amongst the other non-teaching staff, there are a total of 10 employees as Class C and 37 employees as Class D who work in tandem. There are two Laboratory Attendants: Mr. Gaganpreet Singh, and Mr. Sushil, who maintain the computer laboratories and Server Room. Mr. Asmad Ali and Mr. Raj Bahadur are Library Attendants. Ms. Shweta Sharma is the Restorer.

PHYSICAL INFRASTRUCTURE

The college building is spread over an area of 9.17 acres and is the latest and modern in design. The academic area consists of twelve Lecture theatres, sixteen classrooms, twenty Faculty rooms, one Seminar/Conference Hall and canteen area. The entire academic block is linked and well connected by wide stair ways and ramp area. Large balconies enough to house 300 students are available on each floor. All the LTs and classrooms have been fitted with the latest smart gadgetry for teaching.

The Administrative Block includes three floors. The ground floor has Principal's Room, Office, Fee Counter, Bursar's Office, Dean's Room, Vice-Principal's Room, Registrar's Room, Placement Cell, Medical Room and Pantry. The college Library is on the first floor. It has the Reading Hall, stocks, store, and Librarian's office. On the second floor, rooms are allocated for the library, the reading room for boys and girls are housed there. The third floor includes students' activity area which includes gym, sports room, meditation room and society rooms.

The entire area of the college has been designed and developed with the latest design and concepts. The major added features of the infrastructure include the real time air pollution monitoring system installed by the pollution control board in the campus of the college. The solar cells/solar power system has been deployed wherein on 50kw plant capacity is being installed on the roof top. The building is equipped with rain water harvesting system where all the rain water is being collected routed directly into the rain water collection area and in running very efficiently. The entire build up area is adequately filled with complete fire-fighting system. Almost all the rooms and area outside are being monitored by the CCTV cameras. The basement has in house parking facility for parking two wheelers of the college students. Plenty of parking area is available for four wheelers around the entire building of the college. It can accommodate around two hundred cars.

A digital kiosk has been installed in the library to enable the students to find books available in the library and blogs of the teachers.

It has access to 150 MBPS lease line and the whole campus is Wi-Fi enabled. The college has no overhead wiring. It is surrounded by green pavers that will be enhancing the aesthetic beauty in near future. Ramps have been constructed for specially-abled persons with access from all the sides of college building. The Institute envisages a campus that promotes interaction between faculty, students, and scholars of different disciplines. It is planned to make it a 'Green Campus' with minimal energy consumption.

In future, college sports ground and multipurpose auditorium have been planned.

A proud moment in the history of GCCBA was that the foundation stone of the hostel block was laid by Hon'ble Union Home Minister Amit Shah ji on March 27, 2022. The hostel is nearing completion. The estimated cost of the project approved is Rs 17.7 Crores. The approximate plot area for the hostel is 2.17 acres. The hostel will be constructed on four floors including ground floor. It will have two separate blocks for Boys and Girls. The details of the proposed facilities are bedrooms for differently-abled persons, Visitors room, Reception, Office, Store, Hostel Superintendent Room, Lifts, Toilets, Nursing Room, Dining hall, Mess, Pantry, common rooms etc. The hostel will have the future capacity of around 260 beds for Boys and Girls.

SMART CLASSROOMS AND LECTURE THEATRES

The college takes pride in having a very well equipped and acoustically well-maintained Seminar/Conference Hall. The Smart Classrooms are technologically enhanced fostering opportunities for teaching and learning by integrating learning technology, such as computers, specialized software, audience response technology, assistive listening devices, networking, and audio/visual capabilities. All Smart Classrooms support video projection from a laptop and all rooms have resident computers. Wooden dual desks of the latest design are provided to the students for their ease and comfort. The academic area has twelve Lecture theatres, sixteen classrooms, twenty Faculty rooms, one Seminar/Conference Hall and canteen area.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

The college library has been maintained as per the requirements of the students and staff members of the college. It has two reading halls and an outer section hall for its readers for consulting personal books. It has the seating capacity for 140 students. The first floor is equipped with a circulation counter, a reference section, digital corner and a large reading hall with a seating capacity for 100 students at a time. Additionally, the first floor is dedicated to book stacks, a silent reading area with reading carrels, TV display on Library Walls, Property counter, a Faculty research and periodical section. The second floor is equipped with girls' reading room, boys' reading room and one common discussion room for girls and boys. The library has a collection of approximately 7436 documents, this includes textbooks, reference books, general books and non-book materials. There are 1039 books in the Book Bank. Herein, about 23 Magazines, 15 Journals and 16 newspapers have been subscribed. A digital kiosk has been installed in the library to enable the students to find books available in the library and blogs of the teachers. The Digital Corner enables the students and faculty members to access the Web-OPAC (Libsys), N List and database of EBSCO host and PROWESS. The librarian periodically holds various programs like EBSCO Mobile App Training, Reference Writing, Book Review Contests, etc. are organised for enhanced exposure for the orientation of faculty and students.

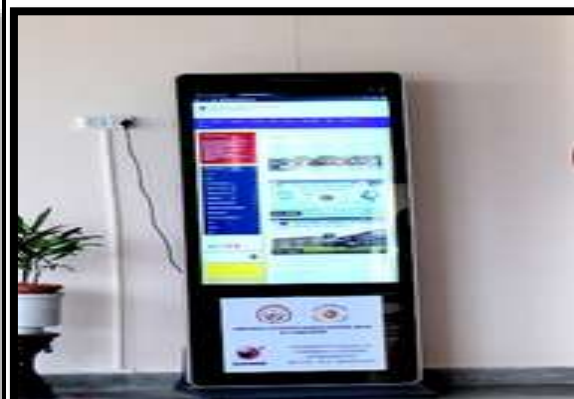

ACADEMICS EXAMINATION















The examination branch functions under *Dr. Magesh V, Registrar, Examinations*, heads his team professionally in successful running of its operations. The branch ensures smooth conduct of the House Examination and University Examinations for a total strength of 811 students (495 boys and 316 girls). They also take care of internal assessment to be sent to Panjab University as per norms. We may be a college in its first phase of growth, but our students have shown appreciable performance in the University Examinations. Our results are better than the university pass percentage.

BEYOND ACADEMICS

Placement and Career Guidance Cell

The Placement Cell is an extension of the academic pursuit. It guides and prepares students to excel in careers, both academic and professional, through diversified exposures both within and outside the campus. The Placement and Career Guidance Cell is headed by Dr, Sangam Kapoor (Dean), with Dr. Monika Aggarwal as the Coordinator, Dr. Aarti Kaushal (Convener), Dr. Kriti Mahajan and Sh. Manjeet Singh coordinate with the different companies and student volunteers. They engage the students in trainings by inviting expert guest speakers from academic and corporate world and conduct placement drives. The following activities were conducted during the session 2024-2025:

July 2024

The month commenced with an insightful seminar by CANAM on success in IELTS for students aspiring to study in Canada, Australia, and the UK on the 30th of July. The next day, on the 31st, Hit Bulls Eye conducted an informative session on securing online internships, guiding students on the process effectively.

August 2024

The first day of August featured a session by IDP on success in IELTS, addressing crucial aspects such as required documents, available courses, and career opportunities. On the 2nd of August, students engaged in an interactive session on social etiquette, conducted by the Finesse Institute of Hospital. Following this, a seminar on study visas, PTE, and IELTS was held on the 6th of August, providing essential guidance on obtaining student visas for studying abroad. The same day witnessed a book giveaway session by Sh. Prem Rawal, who shared insights from "Hear Yourself", encouraging self-awareness among students. Later, a career-oriented session titled "Midas Touch: Catalysing Career" was conducted on the same day, offering motivation and internships to attendees. On the 7th of August, alumni entrepreneur Mr. Saksham Verma led a discussion on entrepreneurship, inspiring students with practical guidance. Competitive exam guidance was provided by Avyukta Academy on the 8th, focusing on preparation strategies. On the 21st, a session by Procter & Gamble centred on personality development

and self-confidence among female students, including a segment on menstrual hygiene awareness. Experiential learning and entrepreneurship were discussed by Skill Labs on the 27th, encouraging students towards practical skill development. The month concluded with an insightful session on ACCA, CA, and CPA by Mrs. Sukhpreet Monga on the 28th, highlighting global career prospects and financial success strategies. On the 29th, a session on exams for studying abroad provided a detailed overview of various international admission tests, followed by a legal awareness session conducted by a session court judge on sexual harassment and drug abuse. Later that day, another seminar titled “Ready to Propel Your Career” was held by Manya Group, discussing international education opportunities. The final event of August was a resume-building session on the 30th, led by Dr. Sneha Sharma, equipping students with essential skills to create impactful CVs.

September 2024

The second day of September featured a talk on Company Secretary (CS) as a career, covering its role in corporate governance. On the 11th, IBS conducted a knowledge-sharing programme focusing on employability skills and sustainable development within AI and leadership roles. The 16th witnessed the IDP Education Fair, offering global education insights and interactive university sessions at Taj Hotel. On the 17th, Infomaths organised a session on MCA entrance exams, guiding students on preparation techniques. Financial literacy was covered extensively by Dr. Monika Aggarwal on the 20th, discussing budgeting, investment, and wealth management. On the 24th, a session on UPSC preparation was conducted by Chanakya IAS Academy, providing an overview of the examination process and career prospects. The month concluded with a session on management accounting by Sanjeev Chadha on the 26th, addressing cost control and budgeting strategies.

October 2024

The 16th featured a career guidance session for training and live projects, presented by a Certified Industrial Accountant, advising students on workshops that enhance employability. On the 22nd, a seminar on career growth was conducted by Mr. Suresh Kumar Gupta, focusing on personality development and professional mindset strategies. On the 26th, the Entrepreneurship Mela “AADHYA” was held, where local entrepreneurs shared their experiences, inspiring students towards business innovation.

November 2024

Punjab and Sind Bank organised a financial awareness session on the 6th, educating students on banking services, digital finance tools, and credit management.

February 2025

The month began with a session on UGC NET on the 6th, conducted by Dr. Arpita Karwa, providing strategies for exam preparation and conceptual clarity. Later that day, the University of Petroleum and Energy Studies hosted a start-up guidance session, inspiring entrepreneurial aspirations. On the 7th, TimesPro conducted career counselling, sharing insights on AI-driven hiring processes. The 11th included the Global Finance Conclave at Chandigarh University, featuring discussions on FinTech, investment strategies, and sustainability. IBS conducted an interview preparation session, helping students refine their job application skills, while IDA hosted a career counselling session on defence sector opportunities. Business Sharks 3.0, conducted by Bulls Eye on the 13th, encouraged entrepreneurship through interactive quizzes and funding opportunities. On the 17th, a personality development and grooming workshop guided students on professional self-presentation and CV building. The month concluded with sessions on ACCA on the 18th, tally software on the 21st, financial awareness in FinTech on the same day, and a Tally Prime workshop on the 24th.

March 2025

The 10th marked a placement drive by Top Rankers, offering roles such as student counsellor and academic associate. The next day, Infomaths organised a placement drive focused on education sector roles. On the 24th, ICICI Bank held a pre-placement talk on career opportunities in banking, followed by an industrial visit to FDDI Banur and a zoo exploration on the 25th. The month ended with the Mega Job Fair on the 27th, attracting students from various government colleges and featuring companies such as WIPRO, IIFL, and Genpact. The Final round of Interviews with 18 short listed students are in process on with Godrej and Boyce Pvt Ltd.

July 2024

The NSS Units of GCCBA-50, Chandigarh, actively participated in various events during July 2024. The month began with the celebration of Van Mahotsav Week from 1st to 7th July, aligning with Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi’s *Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam* campaign. Under the guidance of Principal Dr. Sangam Kapoor and Dean Mr. Amarpreet S. Sijher, 102 volunteers planted saplings in their neighborhoods, reinforcing the importance of environmental conservation.

On 16th July, another Tree Plantation Drive was organized within the college premises, where over 15 trees were planted by 51 enthusiastic volunteers. The same day also witnessed an online session on World Literacy Week, attended by 55 volunteers, focusing on the evolving definition of literacy and its role in societal development.

World Population Day was observed on 17th July through an online meeting that highlighted issues like family planning and sustainable development, with 59 volunteers in attendance. Later, on 23rd July, a sensitization program on the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita was conducted, featuring insights from police officials and lawyers, drawing over 100 participants.

The month concluded with a webinar on the Union Budget 2024-25 led by Dr. Kamal Singh on 28th July, attended by 50 volunteers, followed by an online event for World Nature Conservation Day, where a documentary screening and pledge-taking session emphasized the need for environmental protection.

August 2024

August was marked by a series of impactful events. On 1st August, another Tree Plantation Drive saw volunteers planting trees on campus, continuing the green initiative. The next day, CA Mastan Singh Chambyal conducted an interactive session on the Financial Budget 2024-25, explaining taxation policies to 170+ volunteers.

A Gender Sensitization-themed Poster Making Competition was held on 7th August, with 17 participants showcasing their creativity. The Har Ghar Tiranga Campaign from 9th to 15th August celebrated India’s independence with flag hoisting, rallies, and inter-college competitions. The quiz competition winners included Himani Kumari (1st), Sukhmanjot Singh (2nd), and Divya Thakur (3rd), while the presentation competition was won by Kanika, Abhishek Singh, and Muskan.

Independence Day on 15th August featured cultural performances and a flag-hoisting ceremony. The following day, volunteers celebrated Raksha Bandhan by honoring police officers and health workers at Sector 49 Police Station and Civil Dispensary.

Sadbhavana Diwas on 20th August promoted communal harmony, attended by 105 volunteers. The same day, a Cyber Security Talk by lawyers Ayush Ahuja and Bhanu Sharma educated students on online safety. National Space Day on 23rd August highlighted ISRO’s achievements, and NSS Sports Day on 29th August saw 55 volunteers competing in chess, cricket, table tennis, and basketball.

September 2024

September began with a Women's Health Talk on 11th September by Dr. Balvin Kaur, addressing nutritional and hormonal health for 120 girl volunteers. Health Check-up Camps were organized on 13th and from 15th to 18th September in collaboration with Civil Dispensary, Sector 50, benefiting over 300 students.

World Ozone Day on 16th September saw 50 volunteers pledging for environmental conservation. A career guidance session by Infomaths on 17th September helped 66 students explore higher education options.

From 17th to 24th September, volunteers assisted at Civil Dispensary, Sector 50, in registrations, surveys, and cleanliness drives. The month concluded with a Blood Donation Camp on 19th September, where 70 donors contributed, supported by Red Cross and GMCH-32.

NSS Day celebrations were held on September 24th, themed "From Action to Awareness." This significant event featured three parallel initiatives that exemplified our holistic approach to community service. A team of 40 enthusiastic volunteers conducted a thorough cleanliness drive within and around the college premises, not only improving the physical environment but also engaging local vendors in meaningful discussions about sustainable waste management practices. Their efforts extended to Government High School in Sector-50, where another group of 20 volunteers planted medicinal and fruit-bearing trees in the school's herbal garden, creating a lasting green legacy under the guidance of Principal Ms. Parminder Kaur. Simultaneously, in our adopted village of Kajheri, 30 dedicated volunteers conducted door-to-door awareness campaigns about the "Swachhta hi Seva" mission, effectively bridging the gap between urban and rural communities in matters of public health and sanitation.

Complementing these efforts, we organized a career guidance session in collaboration with Chanakya IAS Academy, where expert Mr. Rahul provided 56 interested students with comprehensive insights into UPSC examination preparation. This session proved particularly valuable for students considering careers in civil services, offering them practical strategies and motivation.

The latter part of September saw intensive participation in the Swachhta Hi Seva campaign, where our volunteers engaged in multiple activities from September 25th to October 2nd. These included awareness rallies through neighborhood streets, innovative eco-brick making using collected plastic waste, educational documentary screenings about waste management, and large-scale cleanliness drives involving 55 dedicated volunteers. The campaign gained special significance as it coincided with the 10th anniversary of the Swachh Bharat Mission, with our college contributing substantially through the creation of over 45 eco-bricks for sustainable construction projects.

October 2024

October witnessed a series of impactful programs beginning with our National Girl Child Day observance on October 9th. This important event featured a signature campaign with empowering messages about gender equality, a solemn pledge-taking ceremony, and informative sessions about government initiatives like Beti Bachao Beti Padhao. These activities successfully raised awareness about gender issues among our student community.

Our anti-corruption drive took a two-pronged approach this year. On October 16th, we conducted a college-wide pledge against corruption, followed by an expert talk on October 23rd featuring police officials from Sector-49 station. These sessions provided valuable insights into recognizing corruption scenarios, understanding legal consequences, and learning about whistleblower protections.

The Khadi promotion event on October 23rd, organized in collaboration with KVIC, served multiple purposes. It not only showcased traditional spinning techniques and products but also highlighted employment opportunities in village industries. The event's success was evident in the significant purchases made by staff and students, directly supporting local artisans and the rural economy.

Our Diwali community service program, "Ye Diwali Bharat Wali," spanned from October 28th to 30th and involved volunteers in multiple meaningful activities. Teams assisted traffic police in managing festive crowds,

supported medical staff at the Civil Dispensary, brought joy to orphanages through gift distributions, and promoted environmental consciousness through a campus-wide eco-friendly Diwali pledge. These initiatives collectively demonstrated how festivals could be celebrated with both joy and social responsibility.

November 2024

November continued our momentum with a Financial Literacy Program on November 6th, featuring banking experts from Punjab & Sind Bank and the Reserve Bank of India. These sessions provided students with crucial knowledge about digital banking safety, government savings schemes, and cyber fraud prevention - essential skills in today's financial landscape.

Our commitment to diversity and inclusion took center stage on November 7th with a powerful session on transgender rights. Activist Vishipreet shared her personal journey, offering volunteers profound insights into the challenges faced by the transgender community, their legal rights, and practical ways to foster greater inclusivity in society.

An Ayurveda awareness session was held on November 8th that covered dosha-based lifestyle adjustments, seasonal health practices, and natural remedies for common ailments. This session, attended by 105 volunteers, provided valuable traditional health knowledge particularly relevant to student life.

On November 9th, we conducted a solemn documentary screening about the Bhopal Gas Tragedy, where volunteers learned about the devastating 1984 industrial disaster and its lasting environmental and human impacts. The screening was followed by thoughtful discussions about industrial safety regulations and corporate accountability, leaving volunteers with a deeper understanding of environmental justice issues.

That same day, we marked the International Day for Preventing Environmental Exploitation in War with another documentary screening. This powerful film illustrated how conflicts worldwide have caused irreversible ecological damage, from deforestation to water contamination. Volunteers engaged in meaningful dialogue about sustainable peacebuilding and the need for stronger international protections for vulnerable ecosystems during wartime.

November 20th saw us celebrating Jan Jatiya Gaurav Diwas with a special documentary honoring tribal freedom fighters, particularly Bhagwan Birsa Munda. The film beautifully showcased the rich cultural heritage of India's tribal communities while highlighting their significant contributions to our independence movement. Volunteers came away with renewed appreciation for tribal traditions and government initiatives supporting tribal education and healthcare.

Our Constitution Day observances on November 26th were particularly comprehensive this year. We organized a three-part program beginning with an insightful documentary about the Constituent Assembly's historic work. This was followed by an engaging online quiz competition that tested participants' knowledge of constitutional principles, with Surya Kumar, Nitasha Khanna and Aman Bharti emerging as top scorers. The day culminated in a moving pledge ceremony where faculty and students collectively reaffirmed their commitment to constitutional values of justice, equality and fraternity.

December 2024

December's activities maintained this momentum with several awareness campaigns. On World AIDS Day (December 1st), our online documentary screening provided crucial information about HIV transmission and prevention while combating harmful stereotypes. Volunteers made heartfelt pledges to support those affected and spread accurate information in their communities.

The following day's National Pollution Control Day program used the anniversary of the Bhopal tragedy to discuss contemporary environmental challenges. Our documentary screening examined various pollution sources and their health impacts, inspiring volunteers to adopt more sustainable lifestyles. The accompanying pledge ceremony emphasized individual responsibility in environmental protection.

December 3rd was particularly busy, featuring both the International Day of Persons with Disabilities and a special visit to the Police Headquarters exhibition. The disabilities awareness documentary powerfully illustrated the daily challenges faced by people with disabilities, while the exhibition showcased cutting-edge advancements in criminal justice technology, including digital forensics and integrated database systems.

Our Armed Forces Flag Day observance on December 7th featured an emotionally moving documentary about military sacrifices, followed by discussions about supporting veterans. The Human Rights Day program on December 10th continued this thoughtful tone, using documentary footage to highlight global human rights struggles and the importance of vigilance in protecting fundamental freedoms.

The month concluded with impactful events blending education and service. Our World Meditation Day camps on December 21st, conducted in collaboration with Vishwas Foundation, taught practical stress-management techniques to over 100 participants. The Traffic Awareness Campaign on December 24th, organized with Chandigarh Police, used interactive demonstrations to promote road safety. December 26th's Chaar Sahibzade Shaheedi Diwas commemoration combined historical education with hands-on service at the local gurudwara, where volunteers assisted with langar preparation and facility cleaning.

January 2025

January's programming began strongly with our National Youth Day blood donation camp on January 9th, where 35 volunteers donated blood under the guidance of medical professionals. The accompanying documentary about Swami Vivekananda's life philosophy inspired participants to channel their youthful energy into nation-building efforts.

Our Lohri Donation Drive on January 13th exemplified the spirit of community service, as volunteers distributed warm clothing and festive treats to over 50 laborers and their families. This hands-on experience in direct service left a lasting impression on all participants.

The month's centerpiece was undoubtedly our intensive seven-day NSS Special Camp from January 18th-25th. Each day blended skill-building workshops with community outreach:

The camp's first half focused on personal development, with certified instructors leading sessions on yoga, self-defense, and digital literacy. Particularly impactful were the cybercrime prevention workshops, where IT experts demonstrated practical online safety measures using real-world examples.

Midweek, the focus shifted outward with visits to Kajheri village for awareness campaigns about tuberculosis prevention and digital inclusion. Volunteers conducted door-to-door education about early TB symptoms and treatment while also helping villagers register for government portals.

The camp's final days featured cultural performances and reflection sessions, where volunteers shared how their perspectives had evolved. The closing ceremony showcased talents developed during the camp, including traditional dances and street plays about social issues.

January concluded with several commemorative events. Republic Day celebrations on January 26th featured patriotic performances after the flag-hoisting ceremony. National Martyrs' Day on January 30th included a documentary about Mahatma Gandhi's principles of non-violence, while our Nasha Mukta Bharat meeting on January 31st brought together educators to strategize about combating youth substance abuse.

February 2025

The NSS unit began February with significant health awareness initiatives. On February 2nd, we observed World Cancer Day through a comprehensive documentary screening that educated volunteers about cancer prevention, early detection methods, and treatment options. The session particularly emphasized lifestyle factors contributing to cancer risks and concluded with a solemn pledge where participants committed to spreading awareness in their communities.

Following this, on February 4th, our team conducted an interactive TB awareness drive at Sector-50 Civil Dispensary. Volunteers engaged with medical professionals to understand ground realities of TB treatment, learning about government healthcare schemes and the social stigma surrounding chronic illnesses. This hands-on experience provided valuable insights into public health challenges.

February 6th featured an inspirational session on "Role of Youth in Nation Building" organized in collaboration with Panjab University. His Eminence Choekyong Palga Rinpoche delivered a transformative keynote address about mindfulness and social responsibility, while Prof. Renu Vig emphasized education's role in youth empowerment. The session left volunteers with renewed motivation to contribute meaningfully to society.

Our health awareness campaigns expanded further on February 7th with back-to-back programs at Government High School (Sector-50) and Khajeri village. Using interactive presentations, volunteers educated students and villagers about TB and cancer prevention, focusing on early symptoms recognition and dispelling common myths about these diseases.

The month's academic focus came on February 10th with our "Pariksha Pe Charcha" event, where students gained valuable exam preparation strategies through an interactive session inspired by Prime Minister Modi's initiative. Participants reported reduced anxiety and improved confidence in their academic approach after learning stress-management techniques.

February 19th saw two major events - an inter-college quiz competition on the Union Budget 2025-26 that tested participants' understanding of economic policies, and a poster-making competition for World Social Justice Day where students creatively highlighted issues like gender equality and poverty eradication through art.

The month concluded with impactful programs on substance abuse awareness. On February 21st, our volunteers attended a powerful anti-drug seminar at PGGCG-42 featuring Governor Shri Gulab Singh Khataria, while February 22nd's Sankalp Diwas observance reinforced national unity through discussions about Jammu & Kashmir.

March 2025

March began with our vibrant Annual Athletic Meet (March 4-5), where NSS volunteers showcased exceptional discipline by winning the march-past competition. The event, inaugurated by DHE Sh. Principal Dr Manjit Kaur distributed certificates to 35 volunteers, recognising their contributions during "Chunav Ka Maha Parv 2024". Alumnus Bhawana recited poetry while Sahil Singla shared his ELC ambassador journey.

22.08.2024 - Educational Trip to Punjab Vidhan Sabha

118 students visited the Le Corbusier-designed Punjab Legislative Assembly, learning about parliamentary procedures from staff. The trip included insights into roles of the Speaker, Chief Minister and opposition leaders, concluding with library visits exploring civil service careers.

03.09.2024 - Voting Procedure Skit

Ten volunteers performed a skit demonstrating college election voting processes. Presented twice across campus, it aimed to boost participation in the upcoming 5th September Students' Council Elections.

25th September 2024 – Election Awareness Drive at PG College, Panchkula

The Electoral Literacy Club collaborated with Government PG College, Sector-1, to engage over 300 students in an extensive Election Awareness Drive. The event featured the *Ballot Brainstorm* MCQ quiz, in which 50 participants tested their knowledge on the electoral process. An *audio quiz* was conducted, where students identified speeches of freedom fighters, fostering historical and civic awareness. A *human chain* was organised to symbolise unity and support for state elections. Additionally, students enthusiastically participated in the "*Every Vote Counts*" signature campaign, where over 350 signatures were collected, reinforcing the importance of individual participation in democracy.

23rd October 2024 – 18th Founder's Day Celebrations

On the occasion of the 18th Founder's Day, the Electoral Literacy Club led a series of events aimed at strengthening student involvement in democratic practices. The college entrance was beautifully illuminated with a floral *rangoli*, signifying the vibrancy and commitment of students towards nation-building. A "*Commitment to Vote*" signature campaign was organised to encourage students to pledge their dedication towards active voting. Several competitions were held, including a *Quiz*, won by Priyanshu Vats and Kanika from BCom 3, a *Mehndi competition*, where Vandana Yadav from BCom 3 and Krisha from BCom 2 emerged victorious, and an *Environmental competition*, in which Akshita and Aakshi from BCom 2 secured the top positions.

29th October 2024 – Electoral Rolls Awareness Lecture

Dr Renuka Mehra, Nodal Officer, led an insightful voter pledge ceremony and a lecture on draft electoral rolls. The session highlighted the significance of voter registration and the importance of reviewing electoral roll drafts for accuracy. As part of the awareness programme, a *human chain* was formed, demonstrating collective commitment to electoral participation. Students also engaged in a *quiz* session, with Kanika and Kshitij from BCom 1 securing the winning spots.

11th–13th November 2024 – Pre-Voters Camp Awareness

A three-day Pre-Voters Camp Awareness programme was conducted, with 25 dedicated volunteers educating students on electoral procedures. The sessions covered key topics such as the *Voter Helpline App*, helping students navigate voter registration, election updates, and polling information. The importance of *Form 6* for new voter registration was also emphasised. Additionally, volunteers facilitated *doorstep voter camps*, ensuring easy and accessible enrollment for eligible students.

14th November 2024 – Voter Enrollment Camp

In collaboration with AERO 09, the club successfully organised a Voter Enrollment Camp, witnessing an overwhelming response with over 250 students registering as voters. Principal Dr Jyoti Seth addressed the gathering, underlining the critical role of youth in *Vikshit Bharat 2047*. The event was supported by election officers Mr Kamlesh and Mr Abhinav, who guided students through the enrollment process and answered queries.

23rd–24th November 2024 – Electoral Rolls Revision

During this two-day event, booth-level officials processed more than 150 citizen queries related to electoral roll revisions. Students and faculty actively participated, ensuring an accurate voter database while addressing concerns about enrollment and corrections.

28th November 2024 – Voter Data Submission

The Electoral Literacy Club compiled and submitted enrollment data from 824 students across various programmes. The submission included detailed records of EPIC and reference numbers, reinforcing the club's commitment to maintaining comprehensive and accurate voter records.

7th January 2025 – Vikshit Bharat 2047 Awareness

The Electoral Literacy Club organised awareness activities at GMHS-RC-II, Dhanas, to educate students on India's vision for *Vikshit Bharat 2047*. The event featured the *Gyan Pradhan Quiz*, where Neha and Aanchal emerged as winners. A *human chain* was formed to promote the significance of the upcoming Prime Minister elections. A rally was also conducted in the market area, with 60 volunteers raising awareness through slogans and interaction with the public. Additionally, demonstrations were given on the effective usage of the *Voter Helpline App*.

24th–25th January 2025 – National Voters' Day Celebrations

The National Voters Day was celebrated over two days with a range of inter-college competitions, including *quiz*, *poster making*, and *declamation contests*, drawing enthusiastic participation from students. Chief Guest **Dr Jagannath Singh Jayara** addressed the gathering, highlighting the role of young voters in strengthening democracy. A *rangoli competition* saw vibrant artistic expressions with ten entries, showcasing creativity inspired by civic themes. The event concluded with a *certificate distribution ceremony*, where election officers were honoured for their contributions.

22nd February 2025 – Sankalp Diwas

Sankalp Diwas was observed with engaging intra-college competitions aimed at reinforcing students' awareness of their roles in nation-building. The *essay writing* competition received 38 entries, focusing on youth contributions to governance and civic responsibility. A *declamation contest* saw 15 participants delivering impactful speeches on electoral rights. The *e-poster making* competition attracted 48 creative entries, visually representing democratic ideals. The event was judged by **Dr Aarti Kaushal**, **Dr Sandeep**, and their team, ensuring fair evaluation.

28th February–1st March 2025 – Rashtrapati Bhavan Educational Visit

Sixty students embarked on an educational tour to **Rashtrapati Bhavan**, where they explored the majestic **Mughal Gardens** and gained insights into India's democratic framework through interactive sessions with officials. The visit provided a unique opportunity for students to engage with governance and policy discussions.

5th March 2025 – Annual Sports Meet Voter Awareness

The college's **15th Annual Athletic Day** was marked by an electoral awareness exhibition, highlighting the importance of informed voting. The *signature campaign* gathered support from attendees, reinforcing democratic participation. Chief Guest **Shri Rubinderjit Singh Brar**, Director of Higher Education, motivated students and volunteers to exercise their electoral rights responsibly.

8th March 2025 – Women's Day Celebrations

In collaboration with the Gender Sensitization Society, the Electoral Literacy Club organised voter rights awareness sessions focusing on women's representation in governance. 14th August 2024 - Tri-Colour Cooking Competition

Marking Independence Day, 20 student teams prepared dishes using saffron, white and green ingredients under the 'Har Ghar Tiranga' theme. Judges Dr Monika Aggarwal and Dr Kamalpreet Kaur evaluated creativity and presentation, awarding trophies to winning teams.

28th August 2024 - Sustainability Exhibition

Partnering with Eco Club and Bharat Soka Gakkai, the committee hosted retired IAF officer Prabhu Nath Sahi for an SDG-focused exhibition. Seventy students attended documentary screenings on sustainable development and global citizenship.

21st December 2024 - Faculty Stress Management Workshop

Dr Meenakshi Gupta (PGIMER) conducted a practical session for staff, demonstrating Sudarshan Kriya breathing techniques and leading a 15-minute meditation to combat workplace stress.

29th January 2025 - Student Open Forum

BLOOD DONATION SOCIETY

Under the guidance of Sh. Gurjinder Singh (Convener), Dr. Subina Syal (Co-convener), and Ms. Vandana Jain, the society has actively organised various initiatives to promote voluntary blood donation, preventive healthcare, and civic engagement. Their dedication and leadership have contributed to the success of numerous impactful events throughout the academic session 2024-25, ensuring that students remain informed and motivated towards contributing meaningfully to society. The society conducted following activities:

13th August 2024 – Har Ghar Tiranga: Reel Making & Poem-Writing Competition

The Blood Donation Society, in collaboration with the Financial Literacy Society, organised a Reel Making and Poem-Writing Competition as part of the *Har Ghar Tiranga* initiative. The event encouraged students to showcase their patriotism through creative expressions centred around the Indian National Flag. Given the flexibility of online submissions, the competition ensured broad participation, reinforcing national pride and artistic engagement.

19th September 2024 – Blood Donation Camp

PHOTOGRAPHY CLUB

The details of the activities done during the year 2024-25 are as follows:

14th August 2024: Photography on Teej

To capture the cultural vibrancy of the Teej Festival, the Photography Club organised an exclusive photography event on 14th August 2024. Students clicked pictures of traditional attire, swings, folk dance, mehendi, and other colourful festivities that reflected the rich cultural heritage of Punjab. 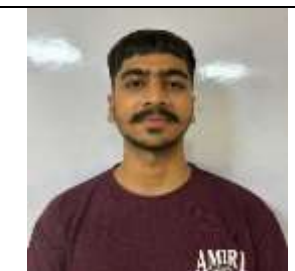
