The college had a very humble beginning in terms of student input and infrastructure in July 2007, but since then it has witnessed unprecedented growth. The college is successfully running BBA and BCA courses in addition to BCom and MCom courses.

The teaching faculty comprises 10 regular members and 1 Librarian on deputation, along with the 13 Assistant Professors on contract basis appointed by the Department of Higher Education. Additionally, 8 faculty members have been engaged under CHES–GCCBA 50 Society for BBA and BCA programmes. The faculty has consistently demonstrated dedication and commitment, contributing significantly to academic excellence and co-curricular achievements.

### **Administrative Support System**

The administrative framework of the college plays a pivotal role in ensuring smooth functioning. The office is headed by Mr. Bhupinder Singh, Senior Assistant, supported by a team of experienced clerical staff including Mrs. Sakshi Rani, Mrs. Surjit Kaur, Mrs. Dalbir Kaur, Mrs. Shitu Gupta, and Mr. Kuldeep Singh.

Technical and operational support is provided by Mrs. Monika (Data Entry Operator), Mr. Ashwani Kumar (Computer Operator), and Mr. Sanjeev Kumar (Stenographer). The institution also has 11 Class C employees and 40 Class D employees, working in coordination to maintain operational efficiency.

Laboratory and library services are supported by Mr. Gaganpreet Singh and Mr. Sushil (Laboratory Attendants) and Dr. Meenakshi Aggarwal & Ms. Shweta Sharma (Library Restorer) with Mr. Asmad Ali and Mr. Raj Bahadur (Library Attendants).

### **INFRASTRUCTURE**

The college campus, spread over 9.17 acres, is designed with modern architectural concepts and provides a conducive environment for academic and co-curricular activities. The entire block is interconnected with wide staircases and ramps, ensuring accessibility. Spacious balconies on each floor accommodate large student gatherings. All classrooms and lecture theaters are equipped with smart teaching tools.

The college has a state-of-the-art infrastructure comprising the following:

- Sports amenities
- Wi-Fi and e-surveillance
- Dedicated Medical room
- Facilities for divyangjan
- 2 Hostels (Separate for Boys and Girls)

The administrative block houses essential offices, including the principal's office, administrative office, fee counter, bursar's office, dean's room, vice-principal's room, registrar's room, placement cell, medical room, and pantry facilities. The upper floors accommodate the library and student activity areas, including the gymnasium, sports room, meditation room, and society rooms.

## **Green Initiatives and Campus Facilities**

The institution has adopted several eco-friendly and technology-driven initiatives. A real-time air pollution monitoring system has been installed in the campus. A 50 KW solar power plant is being installed to promote sustainable energy use. The campus is equipped with an efficient rainwater harvesting system. Safety and security measures include a comprehensive fire-fighting system and extensive CCTV surveillance. The campus is fully Wi-Fi enabled with a 150 Mbps leased line, ensuring uninterrupted internet access. The infrastructure is designed to be inclusive, with ramps for specially-abled individuals. Parking facilities include basement parking for two-wheelers and ample space for approximately 200 four-wheelers.

### **Hostel**

A major infrastructural development for the college is the construction of a new hostel block. The foundation stone was laid by Amit Shah on March 27, 2022. The project, with an estimated cost of ₹17.7 crores, is spread over 2.17 acres. The hostel block was inaugurated on June 5, 2025, by the Honorable Sh. Bandi Sanjay Kumar, the Minister of State for Home Affairs. It has four floors and a capacity of approximately 260 students, with separate accommodation for boys and girls. It will include modern facilities such as rooms for differently-abled students, reception, administrative office, dining hall, mess, pantry, common rooms, lifts, and a nursing room.

### **Safety and Maintenance**

The hostel ensures a secure environment with CCTV surveillance. Clean drinking water is available through Aquaguards and water coolers. Regular cleaning and maintenance ensure hygiene and comfort for all residents.

### **Recreation Facilities at Hostel**

The hostel of Government College of Commerce and Business Administration ensures that students have access to basic recreational facilities to support their physical and mental well-being alongside academics. The hostel is well-equipped with essential facilities and is effectively managed by the Hostel Welfare Committee. The infrastructure, safety measures, and academic support systems create a conducive environment for students' overall development.

### **Smart Classrooms and Teaching Facilities**

The college has developed technologically advanced teaching infrastructure. All classrooms are equipped with audio-visual teaching aids, computers, and projection systems. The seminar/conference hall is acoustically designed to facilitate academic events. Smart classrooms integrate modern teaching tools, including specialized software and networking systems, enhancing the teaching-learning experience. Comfortable and ergonomically designed furniture further supports student engagement.

### **Library**

The college library serves as a vital academic resource center. It has a seating capacity of approximately 140 students and includes two reading halls and a dedicated area for personal study. The library houses 7759 documents, including textbooks, reference books, and other materials. The Book Bank contains 1107 books. Subscriptions include 23 magazines, 12 journals, and 16 newspapers.

The college library is equipped with a digital kiosk to facilitate easy access to its collection and services. It provides access to a wide range of e-resources, including Web-OPAC (KOHA), N-LIST, ONOS, and ProQuest databases, enabling students and faculty to engage in advanced academic and research

activities. In addition, the library has integrated modern technologies such as MYLOFT (My Library on Fingertips) for seamless remote access to e-resources and RFID (Radio Frequency Identification) technology for efficient circulation, security, and management of library resources. The library regularly organizes orientation programmes, user training sessions, and book review activities to enhance information literacy and promote effective utilization of resources among students and faculty.

### **Computer Laboratories and IT Infrastructure**

The college has three well-equipped computer laboratories with modern systems and updated software. A 150 Mbps leased line connection (BSNL) ensures seamless digital access across campus. Wi-Fi routers are installed throughout the campus. Internet usage and security are managed through NEBERO software, which regulates bandwidth and monitors usage patterns. Students are provided open access to computer facilities, supporting academic work, research, and skill development.

### **Sports**

Our college has various facilities for indoor and outdoor games to inculcate the spirit of sportsmanship and healthy competition amongst students. The staff and students regularly play games like Chess, Carrom Board, Table Tennis, Badminton, Football, Cricket, Basketball, badminton. Annual athletics meet is a unique event where faculty and students participate in fun games and track & field events.

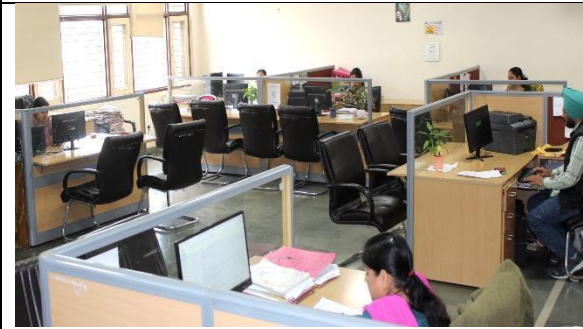

Despite being a college in its initial phase of growth, the institution has demonstrated commendable academic performance. Notably, the university examination results of the college surpass the overall pass percentage of Panjab University, reflecting the institution's commitment to academic excellence.
